supportive housing

Provides a safe and comfortable environment for those with behavioral health, substance abuse, or co-occurring disorders with the ultimate goal of independent living.

support coordination

Assists disabled children, adults, and the elderly and those with behavioral health issues in accessing needed services to increase their independence.

specific assistance

Assists individuals with needs not funded through other grants, providers, or resources.

crisis services

Assists in reducing the use of hospitalizations or visits to the emergency room by the delivery of immediate community based treatments and interventions for families in crises.

LEARN

community psychiatric support treatment services (cpst)

Provides goal-directed support and solution focused interventions, which are intended to assist individuals achieve objectives.

psychosocial rehabilitation services (psr)

Assists individuals with integration as an active and productive member of the community, with the least amount of ongoing supports or interventions.

peers training

Helps teens with Autism learn how to make friends.

earlysteps- system point of entry (spoe)

Identifies, evaluates, and supports infants and toddlers, ages newborn to 3, who may have developmental disabilities.

employment resource & referral

Offers a range of resources that helps prepare individuals for the work force.

campership

Provides funding for summer camp tuition for children and young adults with disabilities.

community engagement

Support from a network of volunteers, advocates, donors and vendors who assist us in sustaining our mission.
